Practice Overview

Stephen Gilmore is Professor of Family Law at the University of Cambridge, CC Ng Fellow in Law at Jesus College Cambridge, and Director of the Cambridge Family Law Centre. He was formerly a Professor and Vice-Dean in the School of Law at King's College London. He is joint Editor of *Child and Family Law Quarterly* and an editorial advisor for the *Family Court Reports* (UK).

Stephen has written across a range of issues in Family Law, with a particular interest in the law of parental responsibility, post-separation parenting arrangements and children's rights. He is co-author of *Children The Modern Law* (4th ed., Family Law), of five editions of a major family law text *Hayes and Williams' Family Law* (Oxford University Press), and of two editions of *Great Debates in Family Law* (Palgrave Macmillan). He is editor of *Parental Rights and Responsibilities* (Routledge) in the *Library of Essays on Family Rights* series. He is also co-editor of *Family Matters - Essays in Honour of John Eekelaar* (Intersentia), *Re-writing Children's Rights Judgments: From Academic Vision to New Practice* (Hart Publishing), *Landmark Cases in Family Law* (Hart Publishing) and *Responsible Parents and Parental Responsibility* (Hart Publishing).
