Practice Overview

Tom specialises in all areas of the law relating to children, including care proceedings, private law proceedings, domestic and international adoption, child abduction, and cases concerning donor-conceived children. He is regularly instructed in complex, high profile or groundbreaking cases, including those with an international element or novel legal issues. He has been instructed at all levels of court, including the High Court, Court of Appeal and Supreme Court.

Tom is a member of the Attorney-General's B Panel of counsel, through which he advises and represents the Government in a range of matters relating to children. He also acts on behalf of parents, children and public bodies in judicial review proceedings.

Tom was shortlisted for Young Family Law Barrister of the Year in 2017 and for Junior Family Law Barrister of the Year in 2020 and 2024. He is described by Chambers and Partners as a 'an absolutely brilliant barrister' with 'a hugely impressive intellect' and a 'calm, authoritative presence in court'. He is described as being 'a veritable family law encyclopedia' and a 'silk of the future'.

Tom is a contributing editor to Clarke, Hall and Morrison on Children.

Children (Public Law)

Tom acts in care, adoption and other public law proceedings, representing parents, local authorities, children and other family members.

Tom is regularly instructed in complex cases, including those involving allegations of non-accidental injury to children, child death, child sexual abuse, and radicalisation. He has appeared in the Family Court, High Court and Court of Appeal, both alone and as a led junior.

Tom is also regularly instructed to advise and act in domestic and international adoption proceedings.

Children (Private Law)

Tom acts for parents, children and other relatives across all private law matters concerning children. He has a wealth of experience in child arrangements disputes, including those involving complex issues such as implacable hostility and allegations of serious physical, sexual and emotional abuse. Many of Tom's cases have an international element, including international child abduction and

applications for permanent or temporary leave to remove children from the jurisdiction.

Tom also specialises in private law disputes concerning donor-conceived children and those from alternative family structures.

Judicial Review & Administrative Law

Tom advises and represents local authorities, parents, and young people in judicial review proceedings.

Tom is appointed to the Attorney-General's B Panel and regularly advises and represents Government departments and other public bodies in matters relating to children.

Tom is appointed to the Attorney-General's Panel of Special Advocates.

International Family Law

Tom's work frequently involves consideration of international issues. He has appeared in such cases at all levels of court, up to and including the Court of Appeal, with and without a leader. He regularly acts for parents and children in matters involving international child abduction, international adoption, permanent leave to relocate with a child, and temporary leave to remove to non-Hague countries.

Tom has been instructed in long-running international litigation concerning children, including the Al Maktoum proceedings and the proceedings concerning child migrants in the British Indian Ocean Territory.

Tom also has experience of cases involving the cross-over between family law and immigration law and those in which issues of diplomatic immunity arise.

Domestic Abuse & Injunctions

Tom represents those seeking, or responding to, non-molestation and occupation orders, forced marriage protection orders, and injunctions under the inherent jurisdiction.

Surrogacy, Adoption & Fertility Law

Tom specialises in cases involving donor-conceived children and children who have been born through surrogacy arrangements. He regularly acts in applications for parental orders, applications for declarations of parentage, and in private law disputes arising concerning donor-conceived children and transgender young people.

Tom is recognised as a leader in this area and regularly appears in the High Court and Court of Appeal in relation to such matters.

Tom has appeared in several cases arising from administrative errors on the part of fertility clinics and the General Registrar's Office. He appeared in *Cases K, L and O* before the President, and has successfully represented parents in a judicial review claim arising from the incorrect registration of a child's birth in such circumstances.
